GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR AUTHORS

Authors are encouraged to submit good-quality, original work: research papers, short scientific communications as well as reviews of books and reports in the area of meteorology and hydrology. Materials earlier published, or accepted to the publication in other editions, are accepted under the decision of the Editorial Board.

Language: Papers are accepted in English. Either British or American English spelling and punctuation may be used. For the special issues published in Cyrillic, papers are accepted in Bulgarian.

Page size and margins: All material on each 16.5 x 23.5 cm page should fit within the following margins: 2.00 cm from the top of the page and ending with 2.00 cm from the bottom. The right and left margins should be 1.5 cm.

Structure: Manuscript should be compiled in the following order: title; authors names; authors affiliations; abstract; keywords; main text; acknowledgments; appendixes (as appropriate); references

Title: should be initial capital letter (except for name), bold and centered on the page in 14-point Times New Roman font.

Authors and affiliations: All the authors of a paper should include their full names, affiliations and postal addresses. Authors' names and affiliations should be centered on the page. For affiliations should be italic style. One author should be identified as the corresponding author with an e-mail address in a footnote.

Abstracts: a maximum of 500 words. Abstracts and keywords should be Times New Roman 10-point.

Body text: a 11-point Times New Roman font should be used, or other Roman font with serifs, as close as possible in appearance to Times Roman. Right margins should be justified, not ragged and single line space must be applied.

Units: Authors must adhere to SI units. Units are not italicised.

Tables/Figures/Images: placed in text as close to the reference as possible. Captions should be Times New Roman 10-point. They should be numbered. Tables are to be numbered separately from the illustrations. Figure's captions should be centered beneath the image or picture, and Table captions should be placed above the table body. Black/white figures should be produced as near to the finished size as possible. Raster images should be not less 300 dpi in the natural size. Tables should not be too bulky. Each table should have a short title.

Citations and references: Citations within the text should include the author's last name and year. If the authors' names are included in the sentence, only the year in parentheses should be placed, otherwise the entire reference has to be placed in parentheses with the authors and year separated by a comma. Multiple references should be listed alphabetically and separated by semicolons. The "et al." construction should be used for citations with three or more authors. The references are in 10 point. References should be completed in the following style: (a) for journal articles - author(s), year in parentheses, paper title, publication name, volume, inclusive page numbers; (b) for books - author(s), year in parentheses, title, publisher, location, page numbers; (c) for contribution in a book: author(s), year in parentheses, title of a contribution, In: editor(s), title, publisher, location, inclusive page numbers.

Author MS Word template: available on www.meteo.bg. Predefined style formats are available for all the necessary structures to be included in the manuscript, and these formats can be quickly accessed using keystroke combinations or the special toolbars provided.

Submission: Authors are encouraged to submit manuscripts electronically. Electronic submissions should be sent as e-mail attachments to BJMH@meteo.bg.
